- Does the householder have a working smoke alarm?
- If the smoke alarm activates, would the householder be able to hear it?
- Does the householder know what to do if the smoke alarm activates?
- Is the householder able to get out of the premises if the smoke alarm activated?

If the householder answers <u>no to any of the questions</u>; the householder should be advised to make a referral for them to receive a home fire safety check from Avon Fire and Rescue, see contact details below.
