- 3.1 As required under the Constitution, the Municipal Calendar is approved each year at the Annual Council Meeting in May. In order to provide as much notice as possible of forthcoming meetings, the aim is to have a draft Municipal Calendar for 2019/20 in place before the end of 2018.
- 3.2 The Executive at its meeting on 16 October 2018 approved a draft calendar of Executive meetings for 2019/20 and these dates are included within the attached draft calendar. The draft calendar will be subject to final approval at the Annual Council Meeting in May 2019 but will provide provisional dates well in advance.
- 3.3 The majority of draft meeting dates follow a similar pattern to the current year. However, in the case of the Planning and Regulatory Committee, it is proposed to move meetings from the second to the third Wednesday of the month. This addresses the need for meetings to take place later in May and January, whilst retaining a regular cycle of meeting dates.
