- On 1<sup>st</sup> October 2019 the BNSSG Clinical Commissioning Group decided to accept the proposals contained in the Healthy Weston Decision Making Business Case
- On 15<sup>th</sup> October 2019, the HOSP resolved that, on the basis of a full review being undertaken one year after the implementation of the changes, not to make a recommendation to Council for referral to the Secretary of State
- This slide deck outlines the proposed process to conduct this review
  and outlines next steps

## **Timeline and remit**



- The HOSP agreed that the review should take place one year after the proposed merger between Weston Area Health Trust and University Hospitals Bristol has taken place
- The merger is not yet finalised, but is currently scheduled to take place in April 2020. Therefore, the review is assumed to be required in April 2020
- The CCG and acute trust colleagues are working with the HOSP to finalise the metrics to support the four key criteria specified by the HOSP in October, taken from the wider outcomes set contained in the Decision Making Business Case

## **HOSP** metrics



- i. The staffing position for urgent and emergency care and the prospect of sustainably staffing a return to a 24/7 rota
- ii. Progress in recruiting primary care staff for the new front door model for the A&E
- iii. Evaluation of the impact and outputs of the mental health community crisis and recovery centre (now known as the Safe Haven Centre) following the setting up of the new service in Spring 2020
- iv. The number of people transferring to care elsewhere in the health system and their experience and outcomes
