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Purpose of report

NHS England require CCG's to produce an annual Children and Young Peoples Emotional health and Wellbeing Transformation plan in response to the 5 year strategy 'Future in Mind' (2015). Future in Mind is a government initiative aiming to transform the way child and adolescent mental health services (CAMHS) and others are delivered nationally.

Future in Mind is about how we need to set about tackling the problems to create a system that brings together the potential of the web, schools, social care, the NHS, the voluntary sector, parents and children and young people.

Key themes:

- Promoting resilience, prevention and early intervention
- Improving access to effective support
- Care for the most vulnerable
- Accountability and transparency

This document serves as the 2019/20 'refresh' of the plan, the last required under the Future in Mind strategy. For this reason, it was felt important that a forward plan of actions on behalf of all partners was included.

2. Recommendations

3. Details

The plan as presented has been overseen by the future in Mind group which comprises a membership of practitioners from provider organisations at operational and strategic levels. It is chaired by Kate Wilcox from North Somerset Council. The progress to date against each of the Future in Mind deliverables is provided in section 5 given with particular reference the recently commissioned Urgent Care and Assessment team (UCAT) within the CAMHS service in Weston. A previous draft of the plan was required by NHS England in August, Their positive feedback has been helpful and assisted in formulating this final draft.

The conclusion notes that whilst steady progress has been made, considerable gaps remain across North Somerset from a capacity perspective and service availability, exacerbated by rising demand for services. The various local priorities have been elicited from discussion within the council, the CCG and with various providers including the North Somerset Parent/Carer forum.

The intention going forward is to prioritise developing capacity for Prevention work and early interventions (tier 2 and 3) with Children and young people in North Somerset presenting with emotional difficulties.
