## LIC Revised Statement of Principles under the Gambling Act 2005 (Agenda 4 Item 6.2)

The Director of Development & Environment reported on a review of the Statement of Principles that set out how the Council would discharge its functions in relation to gambling. Referring to the public consultation that had been undertaken as part of the review the representative of the Director of Development & Environment drew Members' attention to a representation from Clevedon Town Council regarding the adoption of a 'no casino resolution'.

Discussing the revised Statement of Principles the Committee considered that the adoption of a no casino resolution was not necessary as the legislation prevented any new casino licences being issued, concluding that it would be prudent for the Council to reserve its position on this pending any future change in the legislation which might permit new casino licences in the future.

**Recommended to the Council:** that the revised Statement of Principles under the Gambling Act 2005 be adopted and approved.
