RECOMMENDATIONS

That the Committee considers the evidence presented in the application made by Avon & Somerset Police to review the Premises Licence and takes any remedial action deemed appropriate in relation to the matters brought to their attention.

1. SUMMARY OF REPORT

- 1.1 An application was received from Avon & Somerset Police; a Responsible Authority under the Licensing Act 2003, requesting the review of the Premises Licence at Deniz's, 9 St James Street, Weston-super-Mare.
- 1.2 Following a serious assault at the premises in November 2018, CCTV evidence showed customers being served alcohol outside of licensable hours. Subsequent investigations showed that the premises licence had lapsed some two years earlier when the company holding the licence was dissolved by Companies House.
- 1.3 An application for a new licence was granted in December 2018 and since this date there have been a number of breaches of the licensing conditions despite repeated discussions and meetings with both North Somerset Council and Police licensing officers.
- 1.4 As concerns persist, Avon & Somerset Police have recommended that the Premises Licence is reviewed.

2. POLICY

- 2.1 The North Somerset Licensing Authority's Statement of Licensing Policy (2015-2020) applies to the application made. In particular, paragraphs 40-48 of the Licensing Policy relate to the review application.
- 2.2 Regard must be given to the Statutory Guidance issued under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 and the Licensing Act itself.

3. DETAILS

- 3.1 A review application was received from Avon & Somerset Police on 13 February 2019, requesting a review to be undertaken of the Premises Licence for Deniz's, 9 St James Street, Weston-super-Mare. A copy of the application made is shown at **Appendix A**
- 3.2 The premise is a three-storey building of which only the ground floor is subject to the Premises Licence. The Licence has two licensable activities namely the sale of alcohol; for on and off-sales, and late-night refreshment.
- 3.3 There are residential and commercial properties in the proximity of the licensed premises.
- 3.4 The Designated Premises Supervisor for the premises is Mr Huseyin Guldede, Personal Licence number NSC/050704, issued by North Somerset Council.
- 3.5 The review application from Avon & Somerset Police relates to the following licensing objectives:
- a) The Prevention of Crime & Disorder
 - b) The Prevention of Public Nuisance
 - c) Public Safety
- 3.6 A routine Police visit in March 2016 to the premises found the operators to be breaching licence conditions as they did not have a nite-net radio in operation nor an SIA door person on duty. A letter was hand delivered by Andrew Manhire from Avon & Somerset Police Licensing to remind Mr Guldede of the conditions of his licence.
- 3.7 Another visit to the premises in August 2016 showed the operator to still be breaching some of the conditions of their licence. A letter was hand delivered on 11 August 2016. A copy of this is shown at **Appendix B**.
- 3.8 Following a serious assault at the premises on 4 November 2018 the Police obtained CCTV recordings clearly showing alcohol being served at 04:30. The Premises Licence at that time allowed the sale of alcohol until 01:00. A copy of this licence is shown at **Appendix C**.
- 3.9 Whilst looking into this incident, the Licensing Authority became aware that Deniz's Properties Ltd had been dissolved by Companies House in November 2016. If a company is dissolved or becomes insolvent, any licence held under the Licensing Act 2003 will immediately lapse. A visit to the premise was carried out by North Somerset Council Licensing Department and Avon & Somerset Police Licensing to advise Mr Guldede of this and a letter hand delivered. A copy of this letter is shown at **Appendix D**.
- 3.10 A replacement Premises Licence application was submitted by Mr Guldede on 12 December 2018 along with 4 Temporary Event Notice applications to temporarily allow the provision of late night refreshment during the 28-day consultation period. Mr Guldede advised that the majority of his business was carried out after 11pm and therefore wanted to be able to re-open after this time as quickly as possible. He agreed that door staff would be provided after midnight on Friday and Saturday whilst the Temporary Event Notices were in place.

- 3.11 When submitting the application for a new Premises Licence, Mr Guldede agreed to offer the same conditions that he had on the previous licence along with 2 additional ones, namely:
1. A Personal Licence holder shall be on duty at the premises at all times during alcohol sales.
 2. An SIA Door staff member shall be employed from midnight on Friday/Saturday nights and on New Year's Eve and Christmas Eve until close and any time at the written request of Police or Council Licensing Officers. Door staff shall be employed through an ACS accredited company.
- 3.12 No representations to the application were received during the consultation period and the licence was granted and hand delivered to the premise on 7 December 2018. A copy of the Premises Licence is shown at **Appendix E**.
- 3.13 Several inspections and checks have been made to the premises since the granting of the licence have found that Mr Guldede was carrying out his own SIA duties and was not employed through an ACS accredited company. It was also reported that on occasions he was found to be serving food or talking to staff from a nearby premise whilst undertaking the role of SIA door staff. Mr Guldede was telephoned by Avon & Somerset Police Licensing on 17 December 2018 to discuss the issues and his son Eren advised that he was in Turkey following a family bereavement. Eren advised that he would ensure that his dad dealt with the issue upon his return.
- 3.14 A formal meeting was arranged for 4 January 2019 in the Town Hall, Weston super Mare to discuss the issues with the Licensing Authority, Police Licensing, Mr Guldede and his son Eren. They were notified that any further breaches of the licence conditions would result in more formal action being taken. Mr Guldede stated that he would now be employing his door staff through PPI Security who are an ACS company.
- 3.15 Three further licensing checks by Police on 11 January, 2 and 10 February 2019 all showed Mr Guldede was again the only member of SIA door staff on duty. He advised officers that he was being employed through PPI Security.
- 3.16 A call to PPI Security on 4 February 2019 showed that Mr Guldede was in fact not employed through them nor had they ever been approached by him to provide staff at Deniz's.
- 3.17 These continuing breaches of licence and failure to address ongoing concerns give the Police no confidence in the licence holder and have resulted in them requesting a review of the premises licence.

4. CONSULTATION

- 4.1 In accordance with the requirements of the Act the Police have served copies of the application to review the premises licence upon the responsible authorities, the licensing authority and the Premises licence holders.
- 4.2 A notice of application for the review of a Premises Licence was first displayed on 13 February 2019 at Deniz's, 9 St James Street, Weston-super-Mare and at the offices

of the Licensing Authority, Weston-super-Mare Town Hall, in a central and conspicuous place for a period of not less than 28 consecutive days.

- 4.3 An electronic version of the notice was also placed on the North Somerset Council website.

5. FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

6. LEGAL POWERS AND IMPLICATIONS

- 6.1 The Licensing Authority recognises that its licensing function is only one means of securing the delivery of the service. The Licensing Authority will therefore continue to work in partnership with other stakeholders, such as the Police, Crime & Disorder Partnerships and the Vehicle and Vehicle Standards Agency (DVSA) towards the promotion of any licensing objectives.

- 6.2 In undertaking its licensing function, the Licensing Authority has regard to the following legislation:

- Town and Police Clauses Act 1847
- Transport Act 1980 & 1985
- Road Traffic Acts the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976, as amended
- Environmental Protection Act 1990
- Health Act 2006
- The Smoke-free (Premises and Enforcement) Regulations
- The Smoke-free (Vehicle Operators and Penalty Notices) Regulations 2007
- The Equality Act 2010
- The European Convention on Human Rights, which is applied by the Human Rights Act 1998
- The Rehabilitation of Offenders Act 1974 (Exceptions) (Amendment) Order 2002
- Licensing Act 2003
- Gambling Act 2005

- 6.3 The Licensing Authority also has regard to any other relevant legislation, strategies, policies and guidance in its decision-making.

7. RISK MANAGEMENT

- 7.1 Regularly reviewing licensing policies and practices and using a risk-rated approach to both proactive and reactive enforcement reduces the risk to the Authority. Ensuring MoU agreements are in place with external partner agencies will also help strengthen roles and responsibilities surrounding Licensing work.

8. EQUALITY IMPLICATIONS

- 8.1 No equality impact assessment has been required

9. CORPORATE IMPLICATIONS

- 9.1 An appeal against the decision of the Licensing Authority may be made to the Magistrates' Court by the applicant for the review, the holder of the Premises Licence, or any other person who made relevant representation to the application, within 21 days of receipt in writing of any decision made.

10. OPTIONS CONSIDERED

- 10.1 The authority must, having regard to the application, and any relevant representations, take such of the steps mentioned below as it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives.
- 10.2 The steps outlined in section 52 (4) of the Licensing Act 2003 which can be considered are:
- (a) to modify the conditions of the licence;
 - (b) to exclude a licensable activity from the scope of the licence;
 - (c) to remove the designated premises supervisor;
 - (d) to suspend the licence for a period not exceeding three months;
 - (e) to revoke the licence;
- 10.2 In deciding whether to use the powers outlined above, the licensing authority is required, as far as possible, to seek to establish the cause or causes of the concerns which the representations identify. Any remedial action taken should generally be directed at these causes and should always be no more than an appropriate and proportionate response.
- 10.3 Any detrimental financial impact that may result from the licensing authority's decision should be appropriate and proportionate to the promotion of the licensing objectives in the circumstances that gave rise to the application for the review.

Please state yes or no.</p>	<p>The Police as a responsible authority wish to review the premises licence of the premises of Deniz's which is primarily a late night refreshment venue located at 9 St James Street, Weston-super-Mare.</p> <p>The premises was previously The White Hart Public House and the current business has been operating from this location since July 2015 having moved from a smaller premise located close by at 3 St James Street.</p> <p>The owner throughout this time has been the current Premises License Holder and Designated Premise Supervisor being a Mr Huseyin GUILDEDE.</p> <p>Its current permitted opening hours of 1000 to 0230 hours Sunday through to Thursday and 1000 to 0500 hours on Friday and Saturday. In addition there is also a restaurant area to one side which have the following permitted hours for alcohol sales of 1000 to 0100 hours, Monday through Thursday, 1000 to 0200 hours Friday and 1000 to 0300 hours on Saturday and Sunday.</p> <p>Following a police visit in March 2016 at the premises where the operators were found to be breaching the licence conditions to have a nite-net radio and a SIA door person on duty at the required time, which resulted in Andrew MANHIRE the Police Licensing Officer hand delivering a warning letter to the premise.</p> <p>Following a number of breaches of door staff requirements by various late night refreshment venues across Weston-super-Mare, all the late night refreshment venues including this</p>
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premises were hand delivered a warning letter in relation to SIA requirements on the 11th August 2016.

Following a serious assault at the venue at 0430 hours on the Sunday 4th November 2018 police obtained CCTV recordings of the restaurant area and it clearly showed customers being served alcohol despite it being well out of the premises permitted hours for alcohol sales.

This information was furnished to the Council Licensing Team in order that a joint meeting could be held with the Premises License Holder.

However when the Council Licensing Officer checked Company's House for the Premises Licence Holder who was Deniz Property Limited with Huseyin GULDEDE shown as the director it revealed that the company had been dissolved therefore under the Licensing Act the Premises Licence was no longer valid.

On Monday 12th November 2018 Kellie TREGO from North Somerset Council Licensing and Andrew MANHIRE from Police Liquor Licensing met with Mr Huseyin GULDEDE at the venue to discuss the above issues. Initially Mr GULDEDE claimed that there were no alcohol sales after hours and once pointed out that people could clearly be seen being served on the CCTV footage he then suggested that the persons being served were staff which again clearly was not the case.

It was then pointed out to him that due to the Company Holding the Premise Licence going into liquidation there was no longer a valid licence for the premises and therefore the premises would have to stop serving alcohol and hot food/drink from 2300 hours with immediate effect until a new licence was in place.

During the meeting Mr GULDEDE became extremely concerned about the prospects for his business and was pleading to be permitted to operate. It was fully explained to him that this could not be permitted and Andrew MANHIRE explained that as this was the first evidenced occasion that alcohol sales had taken place after hours (if the license was still in place) the police would not oppose a new license providing additional conditions were offered. This included:

- 1) Personal License Holder being on premises during alcohol sales.
- 2) SIA door person to be on duty on Christmas Eve and New Year's Eve and that the SIA staff must be employed through an ACR approved company.

This was due to concerns that he was carrying out his own SIA duties and had been reported that on occasions he was not performing the role properly as he would be found serving food or even walking down the road to talk to staff on the door of Vision (despite these concerns being outlined in the warning letters he had earlier received).

Since the 10th March 2018 there have been 15 crimes reported at the venue the majority being violent related offences, including one where a victim received a broken jaw and one where it was reported that 20 persons were fighting

with knives. In at least two of these offences there were issues with the CCTV one being a camera not working and one where there was no one who could download the required footage.

A new Premises Licence application was subsequently submitted by Mr Huseyin GULDEDE in his own name containing all the conditions on the old license and the additional conditions requested by police and in the short term he submitted Temporary Event Notices to allow him to continue to operate his business. No objections to the new license was received therefore it was granted on the 8th December 2018.

At 0020 hours on Sunday the 16th December 2018 a check of the premises was carried out by Police and the only SIA door person on duty was Mr Huseyin GULDEDE who claimed to be working for 'A Secure Security', in addition the premises was failing to display Part B of the Premise License. On receipt of this information the Police Licensing Officers being aware that this local company was not an ACR approved company attempted to make contact with Mr Huseyin GULDEDE, however they were informed that he had gone back to Turkey for a funeral.

They therefore spoke to his son Eren and explained the concerns to him and it was agreed with the son that Police would not take any enforcement action until his father returned but that it was essential to hold a meeting with him urgently on his return.

On the 4th January 2019 Kellie TREGO from Council Licensing and Andrew MANHIRE from the Police Liquor Licensing Team met with Mr Huseyin GULDEDE and his son Eren at the Town Hall.

During the meeting the serious concerns around the blatant non-compliance with the Premises Licence conditions including the SIA person on duty being employed through an ACR approved company were outlined - in very clear terms. At this point Mr Huseyin GULDEDE stated that they were now employing SIA staff via (PPI Security) being a national firm which the police are aware of and already provides SIA staff for a premises in Weston-super-Mare which also requires an ACR approved company.

In addition they were provided with some helpful printouts and information in relation to ACR approval by Kellie Trego. They were asked if they had any questions or doubts as Mr Huseyin GULDEDE appeared reluctant to listen at which point Eren assured us that he would ensure his father fully understood.

At the conclusion of the meeting Andrew Manhire informed him that this was a final warning and any further non-compliance would very likely lead to a review and or prosecution. He went on to say that if he had any doubts what so ever either to contact Police or Council Licensing.

At 2359 hours on Friday 11th January 2019 a check was commenced at the venue by PC 4317 GATES and the doorman booked in and due to start at midnight was Huseyin

		<p>GULDEDE who claimed to be working for PPI Security.</p> <p>A further check was carried out at the venue by PC 1270 COUNSELL during the early hours of Saturday 2nd February 2019 and Huseyin GULDEDE was again the SIA person on duty and claimed to work for PPI Security. The officer checked his SIA Badge and the SIA register held at the premises and saw that on several occasions Huseyin GULDEDE had incorrectly recorded his badge number and when challenged about this he claimed it was not intentionally but was due to poor eye sight.</p> <p>On Monday 4th February 2019 Andrew MANHIRE, Police Licensing Officer spoke to Mr LANGLEY the General Manager of PPI Security in relation to Deniz's and he had never heard of Deniz's. He confirmed that the only contract they have for supplying SIA door staff in Weston-super-Mare is at the premises of Dragon Kiss.</p> <p>At 0105 hours on Sunday 10th February 2019 PC 2284 PENFOLD carried out a check and again Huseyin GULDEDE was the SIA door person on duty.</p> <p>It is clear that despite trying to work with and give repeated advice and warnings to Mr Huseyin GULDEDE the Premises License Holder – he has repeatedly chosen to blatantly breach the SIA condition on his licence and in addition has repeatedly lied to attempt to cover this up - therefore the Police feel that they have no option but to ask the Licensing Committee to revoke his Licence.</p>

I am Police Constable 1270 COUNSELL of the AVON AND SOMERSET CONSTABULARY, currently stationed at NORTH SOMERSET POLICE CENTRE.

On Saturday 2nd February 2019, I was on duty, in full uniform, on foot patrol in WESTON-SUPER-MARE Town Centre covering the night time economy, in company with Pc 3107 Oliver STOKES.

At 00:46 hours, we completed a SIA Door Supervisor Compliance check at DENIZ KEBAB, ST JAMES ST, WESTON-SUPER-MARE.

Upon entering the premise a male I know to be Huseyin GULDEDE DOB: 03/08/1964 identified himself to be the member of security on duty.

Whilst speaking with GULDEDE he stated that he worked for PPI SECURITY and showed us his SIA Badge number 1011 2948 6304 9493, Expiry 10 Aug 2020- which he had displayed on his arm.

GULDEDE stated that DENIZ KEBABS were going to be changing from PPI SECURITY to different company owned by a male called 'EDDY' next week.

Having checked the NORTH SOMERSET DOOR SUPERVISOR REGISTER for DENIZ KEBABS issued on 07/12/2018, it showed that GULDEDE had entered his SIA Number

incorrectly several times in the Register. The SIA badge number GULDEDE had entered in the Register did not correspond with the number on his SIA Badge.

GULDEDE claimed that this had not done intentionally, stating that he had poor eye sight.

At 00:58 hours I seized the 'NORTH SOMERSET DOOR SUPERVISOR FOR DENIZ KEBABS' as 1270UWC1. This was later booked in to DPR at North Somerset Police Centre. 5219023564 refers.

I later returned to DENIZ in company with PC STOKES to provide GULDEDE with a photocopy of a blank Door Supervisor Register, so that the establishment could continue to comply with legislation (to record Door Supervisors on duty at DENIZ KEBABS).

I also exhibit a 'COPY OF NORTH SOMERSET DOOR SUPERVISOR REGISTER' as 1270UWC2 and a 'PHOTOGRAPH OF HUSEYIN GULDEDE SIA BADGE' as 1270UWC3.

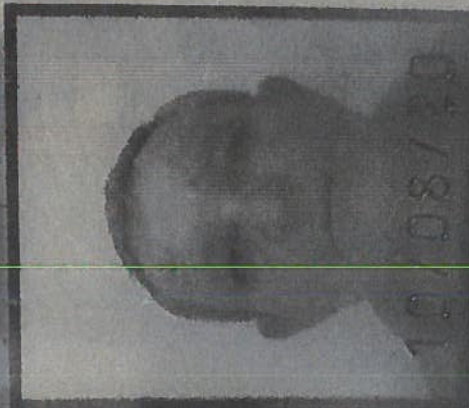

 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and
 - (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
 - (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol, specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.
7. Where films are shown, children shall only be admitted to film showings in accordance with the British Board of Film Classification (or equivalent regulatory body) requirements.
8. Where individuals are required by this licence to carry out a security activity at a specified time or more, they must be:
- (a) be authorised to carry out that activity by a licence granted under the Private Security Industry Act 2001; or
 - (b) be entitled to carry out that activity by virtue of section 4 of that Act.

2. Children under 16 years of age will not be permitted on the premise after 22:00 hours except if having a table meal in the presence of a parent or appropriate adult.
3. All staff shall be trained and regularly refreshed in age challenge procedures e.g. 'Think 21/25' Policy. Staff shall be trained to look at the customer and 'Think 21/25' when selling alcohol to members of the public.
4. A recognised means of identification which includes a photographic image shall be sought from a customer attempting to purchase alcohol where there is a doubt regarding the age of the person seeking to make such a purchase.
