Recommendations

That the Licensing Sub-Committee considers and determines the application made by Mr David Jones for a Street Cafe Permit at The Limehouse, 59 Hill Road, Clevedon, Somerset, BS21 7PD

1. Summary of report

1.1 An application has been received from Mr Jones for permission to place tables and chairs on the highway. Consultations have been carried out and an objection against the grant of the licence has been raised by a local resident. The principle concerns raised are, public health and anti-social behaviour.

2. Policy

2.1 On the 26th January 2009 a district wide scheme for the placing of tables and chairs on the highway was approved by the Executive Member for Strategic Planning Highways and Economic Development. The approved scheme included guidance notes for applicants which set out the procedural and policy requirements for the operation of the scheme. The most recent policy review was in January 2020. A copy of the policy will be available at the hearing.

Details

- 3.1 The premises currently holds a Street Café Permit for tables and chairs on the public footpath area directly outside the premises. This permit was issued under the Business and Planning Act 2020 and is in place until 30 September 2023 where it will need to be renewed.
- 3.2 The Business and Planning Act 2020 was introduced with the purpose of allowing certain business sectors to operate whilst managing the risks arising from the COVID-19 pandemic.

- 3.2 In June 2023 a further application under the Business and Planning Act 2020 was received to place additional furniture on the highway within the 'parklet' area in Hill Road. Objections to this application were received which resulted in the application being refused.
- 3.4 An application has been received from Mr David Jones for permission to place tables and chairs on the highway at, The Limehouse, 59 Hill Road, Clevedon, Somerset, BS21 7PD, A copy of the application made is shown at *Appendix 1*
- 3.5 The applicant has requested the use of the highway as a Street Café area during the following times:

- 3.6 The application site for the proposed Street Café area is shown in the general location plan at *Appendix 2*.
- 3.7 The Limehouse, 59 Hill Road, Clevedon, Somerset, BS21 7PD has commercial and residential properties within 100 metres of the premises.
- 3.8 This is a new application made under the Highways Act 1980, for the parklet area on the public highway and no permissions have previously been granted to place tables and chairs on this site.

4. Consultation

- 4.1 Officers have followed the consultation process as outlined in the agreed Street Café Licence Guidelines.
- 4.2 A notice was placed at the premises for a period of 28 days detailing the application made.
- 4.3 As a result of the consultations the following responses have been received:

6. Legal powers and implications

- The Licensing Authority recognises that its licensing function is only one means of securing the delivery of the service. The Licensing Authority will therefore continue to work in partnership with other stakeholders, such as the Police, Crime & Disorder Partnerships and the Vehicle and Vehicle Standards Agency (DVSA) towards the promotion of any licensing objectives.
- 6.2 In undertaking this licensing function, the Licensing Authority has regard to the following legislation:
 - Highways Act 1980
 - The Equality Act 2010
 - The European Convention on Human Rights, which is applied by the Human Rights Act 1998
 - The Rehabilitation of Offenders Act 1974 (Exceptions) (Amendment) Order 2002
- 6.3 The Licensing Authority also has regard to any other relevant legislation, strategies, policies, and guidance in its decision-making.

7. Climate change and environmental implications

There are no climate change or environmental implications noted in this report.

8. Risk management

8.1 Regularly reviewing licensing policies and practices and using a risk-rated approach to both proactive and reactive enforcement reduces the risk to the Authority. Ensuring MoU agreements are in place with external partner agencies will also help strengthen roles and responsibilities surrounding Licensing work.

9. Equality implications

None.

10. Corporate implications

10.1 Under the provisions of the Highways Act 1980 the Council may grant permission to place tables and chairs on the highway as they deem appropriate. When granting a permit, the Council may attach such conditions to it as they consider reasonably necessary.

- 10.2 There are no legal rights of appeal against the Licensing Sub-Committee's decision to refuse to grant a permit to place tables and chairs on the highway. Judicial Review on procedural issues in dealing with the application is though possible.
- 10.3 The provisions of the Human Rights Act 1998 apply to the process of granting a permit to place tables and chairs on the highway.

11. Options considered

- 11.1 The following options are available to the Licensing Sub-Committee with regard to the application that has been made:
 - a) Grant the application as applied for.
 - b) Grant the application as applied for but with modifications to the terms sought.
 - c) Refuse the application.
- 11.2 Should the application be granted the standard conditions as outlined in the guidance notes are recommended to be attached to the permit granted.



Dear Licensing Committee members,

Please let me introduce myself my name is David Jones and I have been the owner of LIMEHOUSE since March 2016. I have held my personal licence since 2007 and been in the hospitality industry for 25yrs.

LIMEHOUSE is a restaurant and cocktail bar situated on Hill Road in Clevedon. LIMEHOUSE is open from 12pm every day (Except Monday: Closed) and closes at 11pm or midnight depending on the day of the week. Due to our location and food and beverage offering we tend to attract a very good cliental, a large volume of whom support us with their repeat business.

LIMEHOUSE's General Manager Kieran holds a personal license and alongside his own substantial hospitality experience has been employed by LIMEHOUSE for 5 years to date. We also have 2 supervisors holding personal licences, granted through their role training for LIMEHOUSE, both have been with me for over a year. I can therefore assure you the venue has an experienced and loyal management team in place who know the customers and venue very well.

The business has had deal with a few very challenging years from Covid 19 to now dealing with the cost-of-living crisis. The business is still trying to recover financially due to these challenges including the repayment of the £50,000 bounce back loan taken to keep the business afloat during this troubled time. Now with the cost-of-living crisis we are seeing trade drop again and it is recognised that spend is down across the whole hospitality sector. Food prices, utilities and wages remain a challenge with consistent increases.

News of the potential parklets that would add additional seating was very welcomed and would offer us a much-needed increase in outdoor space to serve more customers. This would give a lifeline in the hot summer months when people prefer not to eat and drink indoors. This would/has gone along way into supporting the business financially and therefore the employment security of the 18 staff LIMEHOUSE employs.

Should this application be granted we aim to use more of the same furniture that that was approved by licensing for the street café seating area. We believe this is in keeping with the surrounding area and overall feel of Hill Road. We have to date invested over £8000.00 enhancing this outside area which includes a canopy, planters and luxury tables and chairs. This investment would continue should the license be granted.

Quote from a spokesperson from North Somerset council: North somerset times

"The parklets can help boost economic growth through more seating encouraging people to stay in the area longer" I fully agree with this statement and could say first hand to be true.

Currently the business has an existing the outdoor seating licence till 10pm but we have taken the decision to bring the tables in at 9pm. All shift managers and supervisors have been re trained and do now speak to customers as the leave reminding them to keep noise to a minimum. This is backed up by signage which after a recent listening visit have been re positioned them to make it clearer for customers to see. We could increase the amount of signage should you wish.

We have decided to only to apply for an 8pm. This is mainly to capitalise from a potential lunch and early evening trade. Tables and chairs would be packed away after this point. Any customers would be directed indoors. We are not looking to promote late night drinkers outside the venue, and this can been seen through this early finish (Much earlier than other venues on the street).

Should the license be granted we will plant and maintain a flower bed very similar to the existing parklets on hill road. Please see pictures, I believe that they look fantastic and not just provide space but also add a garden feel to the urban street.

I would like to address some points that have been made out by a single objector.

Point 1 (Health).

These table are non-smoking tables, and always have been. As we serve food on them it would be unfair on the customers eating. We now have clear signage to state this.

Staff have been trained to ask anyone who choosing to ignore this, to kindly smoking around the side of the venue away from the street.

Point 2 (Antisocial behaviour).

We are not looking to have late night drinkers outside the venue.

Any anti-social behaviour will result in customers refused service, again staff have been trained to keep a close eye on this.

I won't deny that there was an altercation outside the venue, this was caused by someone we've never seen before or since. I am sorry for this, It was a very rare incident.

I have taken into consideration the objector's opinion and as a direct result made some clear changes, including signage, shutting the seating area earlier and enhance staff training. As a business we would just like to be good neighbours and to be able to conduct our operation with the added tools that the council have offered us.

Please also take into consideration some letters of support from some of our very close neighbours and the head of Clevedon's business improvement district (BID). They encourage the application and many, many people that I have spoken to also support us.





We note how well the other parklets have been received by the vast majority and whilst we do not have formal consultation if the feedback on – for example – Facebook is followed there are hundreds of positive replies and 'likes' and only a handful of negative replies or comments. The street is much enhanced by the effect of the Fallen Tree and Butterflies parklets.
