- The Chairperson invites the applicant/applicant's representative to clarify the application and to address the representations made. All parties may then ask questions of the applicant or make comment at the discretion of the Chairperson.
- 4 The parties are then invited to sum up
- 5 The Sub-Committee then withdraws to consider the submissions and to make its deliberations
- On returning to the meeting with all parties present, the Chairperson/Legal Adviser to the Sub-Committee will announce the decision

Please note:-

All persons who have written to the Licensing Authority in connection with any of the applications on the agenda will have been invited to attend the hearing.

The Chairperson appointed for the meeting shall have absolute control of the Hearing and the ruling of the Chairperson shall be final.

The Legal Advisor to the Sub-Committee can assist the Chairperson during the Hearing and may interrupt proceedings when it is considered necessary to ensure that the Sub Committee is able to determine the application fairly.

Recommendations

That the sub committee determines the application for the grant of the premises licence.

1. Summary of report

1.1 An application has been received for the grant of a premises licence for Posh Spice, 86 High Street, Nailsea. The premises had a licence in place previously that was revoked by licensing sub-committee on 17 April 2023.

Consultations have been carried out and representations have been received from both Avon and Somerset Constabulary and Nailsea Town Council. They believe that due to the history of the premises the applicant will not adequately promote the Licensing Objectives.

2. Policy

- 2.1 The Council's statement of Licensing Policy applies to this application.
- 2.2 The Licensing Act 2003 requires licensing authorities to carry out their functions with a view to promoting the following four licensing objectives:
 - a) The Prevention of Crime and Disorder.
 - b) Public Safety.
 - c) The Prevention of Public Nuisance, and
 - d) The Protection of Children from Harm.
- 2.3 The Licensing Authority should have regard to the Statutory Guidance issued under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003, and the provisions of the Licensing Act itself.

3. Details

- 3.1 A premises licence for Posh Spice, 86 High Street, Nailsea was in force from 19 August 2005 until it was revoked following a review of the licence on 17 April 2023.
- 3.2 An application for the grant of a new premises licence under the Licensing Act 2003 was received on 20 August 2023 from Mr Ashequl Bari Numan. A copy of the application that has been made is shown at Appendix A.
- 3.3 A representation was received from Avon & Somerset Police outlining the links between the applicant and previous licence holder which gives them cause for concern.
- 3.3 The premises is a two-storey building with the licenced premises being located solely on the ground floor. The application is for licensable activities including late night refreshment and the sale of alcohol.
- 3.4 There are residential and commercial properties in the proximity of the licensed premises.
- 3.5 A copy of a location plan of the premises is shown at Appendix B.
- 3.6 The licensable activities and opening times of the premises to members of the public being sought are as follows:

4. Consultation

- 4.1 In accordance with the requirements of the Act the applicant has:
 - Served copies of the application to the Responsible Authorities.
 - (b) Advertised the submission of the application in a local newspaper.
 - (c) Placed a notice at the property detailing the application made.
- 4.2 The notices advertising the application were not displayed in accordance with the Licensing Act 2003, therefore the 28 day consultation period was restarted and the last date for representations was extended accordingly.

- 6.3 The Licensing Authority also has regard to any other relevant legislation, strategies, policies, and guidance in its decision-making.

8.1 Regularly reviewing licensing policies and practices and using a risk-rated approach to both proactive and reactive enforcement reduces the risk to the Authority.

- a) Grant the application as applied for, or
- b) Grant the application with modifications to the dates or timing of licensable activities or conditions to be attached to the licence.
- c) Refuse the application.

For the purpose of sub section 11(b) above conditions are modified if any of them are altered or omitted or any new condition is added.

- 3. The CCTV views are not to be obstructed, at least one CCTV camera is to be placed near to the exit in order to capture clear facial images of all patrons leaving the premises
- 4. A suitable trained staff member will be able to show and provide police or council licensing officers recent data footage with the minimum delay when requested.
- 5. All goods, including those subject to duty payments i.e. alcohol and tobacco products will be brought from cash and carries only an invoices and they will be available upon request. All alcohol will be purchased from AWRS registered cash & carry or wholesalers.
- 6. All staff employed at the premises will have UK right to work status checked, once passed that stage they shall be offered employment.
- 7. All on sales of alcohol must me made with a substantial eat in meal.
- 8. All off sales must be ancillary to a takeaway meal
- 9. No open vessels to be taken outside the curtilage of the premises at any time.

10.Mr Golap Miah does not own the business anymore and does not have any business connection with the new owner Mr Ashequl Numan, lease documents can be provided to show that Mr Numan holds possession of the property and is the owner.

- c) Public safety
- 1. Installation of appropriate safety equipment
- 2. Fire exit signs displayed
- CCTV working at all times
- At least 1 member of staff shall have a Level 2 Food Safety qualification.
- d) The prevention of public nuisance
- Notice displayed asking customers to leave quietly from premises also customers will be told in person to leave quietly and not to disturb the local neighbourhood
- 2. Strict policy in place to tell all staff not to serve alcohol to drunks at all
- 3. Appropriate signage will be displayed, in prominent position informing customers they are being recorded on CCTV
- e) The protection of children from harm
- A challenge 25 policy will be in force, where any person looking under the age of 25 shall be asked to prove their age when attempting to purchase alcohol and signs to this effect will be displayed at the premises. Challenge 25 posters displayed where alcohol is sold.
- The only acceptable ID will be those with photographic identification documents, including passport, photo-card, driving license or proof of age card bearing the PASS hologram.

 work and is not subject to a condition preventing the holder from doing work relating to the carrying on of a
 licensable activity.
- A current Biometric Immigration Document (Biometric Residence Permit) issued by the Home Office to the holder which indicates that the named person can currently stay in the UK and is allowed to work relation to the carrying on of a licensable activity.
- A current Residence Card issued by the Home Office to a person who is not a national of a European Economic
 Area state or Switzerland but who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights or
 residence.
- A current Immigration Status Document containing a photograph issued by the Home Office to the holder





PROPOSED LICENSING FLOOR PLAN







The Avon and Somerset Constabulary as a responsible Authority oppose the application for a Premise License for Posh Spice - Indian Restaurant located in High Street, Nailsea as they believe the applicant will not promote the Crime and Disorder or Protection of Children from harm Licensing Objectives.

The premise itself was a Licensed Indian Restaurant for many years with a Mr Golap MIAH being the Premises Licence holder.

The Immigration Service made two enforcement visits to the premise on the 24^{th of} June 2022 and 18th February 2023 and on both occasions illegal workers were discovered and a Civil Penalty was served on the then Premise License holder Mr Golap MIAH.

The Immigration Service then also called a review of the Premise License and following the hearing before this Licensing Committee on the 17th of April 2023 the Premise License was revoked.

A new application was then received from a Ashequl Bari NUMAN for a Premises License at this premise. In the application it states that Mr Numan is the new owner of the business and shall have 100% control over the business and make all the decisions.

Following receipt of this application Police Licensing Officer Andrew Manhire arranged a joint visit to the premise in company with Caz HORTON from North Somerset Council Licensing on Thursday 15th June to meet the applicant Mr Numan and the police were aware had been working at Posh Spice at the time of the last Immigration enforcement visit.

On arrival they were not only met by Mr Numan but his proposed Designated Premise Supervisor (DPS) Mohammed Iqbel MIAH who Mr Numan introduced as his uncle and business partner which clearly contradicts the statement on the application paperwork, indicating that he was going to be the sole owner.

A discussion took place about Mr Numan's previous involvement at the premise, and he indicated that he had worked there for about 12 months part time.

Mr Miah was asked if had any previous involvement with the business and whether he was related or had any previous connection with Mr

Golap MIAH which he denied. It was then pointed out to him that it appeared he was connected with Golap MIAH from court records which he continued to deny. It was only after it was pointed out to him that both were convicted of Immigration Offences at Bristol Crown Court on the 21^{st of} February 2014 (See attached previous convictions printouts) that he stated that there were so many defendants involved in that case and that was the reason he gave the answer he did. (It was noted that despite both persons speaking good English when this was raised, they started communicating in a foreign language). They have also both been resident at the same home address of 2 Banks Close, Clevedon.

Following this meeting it was confirmed by Peter Hardman and Jane Day from North Somerset Council Food Safety Team who have been dealing with the Miah family for many years revealed that Galop Miah and Mohammed Miah far from not knowing each other are actually brothers.

(See attached statement from Peter Hardman and statement 1 and 2 from Jane Day).

Mr Numan was asked when he took over the business and indicated it was roughly the end of May but when pushed was unable or unwilling to give an exact date. He was asked to provide any bank statements etc to show his purchase of the business but stated that no money was involved. He was then asked to provide a copy of the insurance certificate for the business, a copy of the lease and any other legal paperwork to evidence that he was the legal owner of the business as claimed but stated that he had this, but it was not at the business premise at present but would forward these documents to me.

He later provided an insurance certificate for the business which was valid from the day after the meeting held with the Police and Council Licensing Officers and a Lease in his name.

This matter went before a Licensing Committee hearing on the 20^{th of} July 2023, but Mr Numan's solicitor withdrew the application at this hearing.

At the end of August 2023, a further Premises License application was received for the premises. This application was largely a copy of the withdrawn application with the exception that the nominated (DPS) had been changed from Mohammed Iqbal MIAH to Ashequl Bari NUMAN.

At just before 6pm on Wednesday 20th September 2023 a warrant was carried out on the premise under Immigration legislation by the Immigration service who were accompanied by staff from North Somerset Council Licensing and Food Teams along with Police Licensing Officer Andrew Manhire.

Initially persons attempted to run from the premise via the rear doors but were detained. The premise was due to open at 6pm and there were no customers present, among the persons on the premise at the time were the Premise License applicant Ashequl Bari NUMAN and Mohammed Iqbal MIAH. Checks of the other persons present revealed two persons in breach of Immigration Law who were subsequently arrested.

A closure order was therefore placed on the premises and the following morning the Immigration Service were successful in obtaining a Compliance Order at North Somerset Magistrates Court which allows them to make a visit every month for the next 6 months with a power of entry attached to the order.

Despite being told by Police and Council Licensing Officers at their meeting at the premise on the 15th June 2023 that with no Premises licence in place they needed to remove or at least cover all alcohol from view Andrew Manhire and Caz Horton saw there were many bottles of white and rose wine including two part bottles clearly in view in a refrigerator next to the bar along with a bottle of champagne and bottles of Tiger beer. In addition, on the lower shelf at the back of the bar there were many bottles of red wine clearly visible. Further checking of the premise revealed a bucket full of approximately 10 partially full bottles of various spirits still with the optic's attached located in the disabled toilet meaning that any customers including children would have unsupervised access. Mr NUMAN was again advised that all alcohol had to be removed or at least covered from sight.

The food team Inspectors wanted to check the flats above as it was indicated that it was used as a rest area by staff, so they were asked for the keys to access the separate door to this area located at the front to the right of the premise and were informed that the keys were behind the bar. A bunch of keys were then located behind the bar which gave access to the flats which Mr Numan claims was being used as a rest area for staff. This bunch of keys also included a Mercedes car key for a black BMW parked directly outside and it transpired that this bunch of keys belonged to Mohammed Iqbal MIAH, which clearly infers he still has considerable control over the business.

It is worthy of note that the company listed as the food provider at this premises is Maneera and Co Nailsea Ltd and company house records show two directors Ashequl Bari NUMAN and Mohammed Igbal MIAH. (See statement 3 from Jane DAY).

An appointment was made to see Mr NUMAN at the premises at 1pm on Wednesday 27th September 2023 to discuss this application and he was informed by Police Liquor Licensing Officer Andrew Manhire that at this meeting he would like to see all the documentary evidence he had to show that he owned the business.

Due to a family issue Mr NUMAN was unable to make the appointment so Andrew Manhire sent him and his agent email correspondence requesting various documents to assist in proving ownership of the business (See attached copy) and knowing that the Immigration Service were due to visit the premise later that day at just before 6pm he attended the premise in company with Caz HORTON where they saw Mr NUMAN. Despite having a week's notice to gather documents together he was unable or unwilling to provide a single document as requested.

When Mr Numan was questioned about the lease, he stated that he was sub-letting from Golap MiAH but paying the money for the lease direct to the premise owner. He was then asked to show his Bank

account which the money came out of and initially got his mobile in order to do this but then stated he didn't have the card, so could not access his account.

He was then asked about payment to Mr Golap MIAH for the fixture and fittings along with the goodwill built up by such an established business which is normal business practice but again claimed that no payment took place and that Mr Golap MIAH just wanted out and had gifted him the business as he was no longer in the Country. He accepted that the equipment in a professional kitchen, along with all the chairs, tables, individually Posh Spice crested tableware etc would cost 10's of thousands of pounds.

In conclusion the Police strongly believe that the Premises Licence holder Mr Golap MIAH still owns the business, and that Mr NUMAN is merely a front man put forward purely for the purpose of obtaining a Premises Licence.

This Licensing Committee made the decision to revoke the previous Premise License after which a further warrant was carried out at the premises on the 20th of September 2023 - when yet again the premises was found to have persons working in breach of Immigration Law.

This is when Mr NUMAN claimed to be the owner and running the business and the Police feel that they have no option but to ask this Committee to reject this application for the reasons highlighted.

I concluded the visual inspection of the premises and 12 discussed my findings with Team Leader Jane Day. During the discussion I was 13 showing Mrs Day the Food Hygiene training certificates for Mr Shaju Miah when she 14 said "That's his brother. Golap's brother". 15 I stopped video recording at 20:20 and waited for the Immigration officers to 16 conclude their work. Whilst waiting, I spoke to a man who appeared to be in control

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of the employees and asked his name and whether he was the manager. He

This statement (consisting of 2 pages) is true to the best of my knowledge and belief and I make it knowing that, if it is tendered in evidence, I shall be liable to prosecution if I have wilfully stated in it anything which I know to be false or do not believe to be true.

I, Jane Catherine Day, hold the post of Food and Commercial Safety Service Leader and am an authorised inspector of food safety and health and safety in the food and commercial safety team in the Regulatory Services division of the Public Health and Regulatory Services Directorate at North Somerset Council. I have held the post as a qualified food inspector and inspector of health and safety for over 30 years. I hold a NEBOSH qualification and am also registered with the Environmental Health Officers Registration Board and am a voting member of the Chartered Institute of Environmental Health. Prior to becoming the team manager I was a full time inspecting officer for over 26 years spending all of my career at North Somerset Council. I therefore have great knowledge of food businesses in North Somerset and of their ownership. Posh Spice in Nailsea is particularly rememberable to me as there is a long history of non-compliance, both in terms of food safety and in relation to immigration offences. Over the years I have dealt with Posh Spice, Nailsea,

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Yatton Tandoori, Yatton and Britannia Spice, Backwell. I am aware that the businesses are owned by three brothers known to me as Golap Miah, Iqbal Miah and Shaju Miah. Over the years the brothers have each made an appearance at each of the restaurants, regardless of who its registered to, as they step in if their sibling is not available. This has been common practice over the last 15 or so years. I have met all three brothers on many occasions. In 2013 I was approached by PC Gemma Kirby in relation to offences around 'arranged marriages' and I supplied a section 9 statement for the ensuing successful prosecution. In this statement I clearly state my knowledge that the three gentlemen are brothers. I exhibit this statement at JCD1. I also exhibit an email from PC Gemma Kirby following the prosecution hearing. The email is entitled 'the Miah brothers' and gives a summary of the sentences they received. This clearly infers that Golap Miah, Igbal Miah and Shaju Miah are brothers. I exhibit this email as JCD 2. On 31 October 2016 one of my colleagues who has now left the authority conducted a food hygiene inspection at Posh Spice in Nailsea. On his inspection notes he states that he interviewed Mr Igbal Miah (despite his brother, Golap Miah, being at that time the registered owner) and states that Golap Miah was the chef along with the other brother Shaju Miah. This illustrates my point above that the brothers often interchanged with each other and all oversaw the running of the businesses collectively despite the registered ownership. I exhibit the inspection report as JCD 3. On 7 March 2019 my colleague Ray Fox undertook another food hygiene inspection at Posh Spice in Nailsea and despite Mr Golap Miah being the registered owner he dealt with Mr Shaju Miah. This further illustrates my point above. I exhibit this inspection report as JCD 4. I am aware that Mr Iqbal Miah

Regulation 14 of The Food Hygiene (England) Regulations 2006 provides a right of entry to premises in order to carry out compliance inspections. It is an offence to obstruct an officer working within this power. The frequency with which we make unannounced inspections of business premises is very much dependent on how they performed at the previous inspection and if any actions for improvement were set. We take a staged approach to enforcement, with the aim of assisting businesses to comply with the legislation by giving them a defined period of time to improve and meet the required legal standard. However, this depends on the issues encountered upon inspection; for example if I discovered a rodent infestation I would order the immediate closure of the premises, or if a hand wash basin was inaccessible or not fitted I would write a formal letter to the Food Business Operator and/or manager giving them a set time period to rectify this.

Following an inspection the business will be risk assessed to determine when the next inspection should occur. If a business is compliant and rated highly then it might be another 18-24 months before another inspection takes place. The Food Standards Agency has devised a Food Hygiene Rating scheme that gives a business a rating of 1 to 5, 5 being very good, depending on their performance in an inspection.

Records are compiled by officers who had personal knowledge of the matters dealt with in the course of their duties. The details included in this statement have been drawn from systems that I have access to and that hold these records. Some of the records will have been made by me, others by my team colleagues.

It is whilst carrying out my role as Principal Officer of Public Health that I have come to know Mr Golap MIAH, Mr Iqbal MIAH and Mr Shaju MIAH, three brothers of Asian decent who between them are, or have been, responsible for the following Indian restaurants/takeaways; YATTON TANDOORI, POSH SPICE, BRITANNIA SPICE and PAPRIKA.

I have completed a search of computer and paper based records for the above businesses and, as a result, have been able to provide the following to PC 1287 KIRBY as a result of her Data Protection Act request.

On 1st July 2002 Golap MIAH completed an application form to register a food business. He listed himself as the proprietor of YATTON TANDOORI, 65 HIGH STREET, YATTON, BA49 4EQ and the manager as Mizan ALI. On 5th April 2004 he submitted a further form to amend the manager to Golap MIAH. However, the form Golap MIAH had submitted didn't reflect the conversation he had had during an inspection on 2nd March 2004 where he indicated to the attending officer that the business was owned by a limited company. As a result a letter dated 4th August 2004 was sent to Golap MIAH asking him to complete another registration form. On 8th August 2004 Golap MIAH completed this registration form but provided himself as the proprietor and Iqbal MIAH as the manager. On 17th November 2011 Shaju MIAH submitted an application form stating that he was now the manager and the proprietor of the business was "MR SHAHIDA NESSA GOLAP MIAH".

The most recent registration form, completed on 16th October 2012, lists Shaju MIAH of 20 BANKS CLOSE, CLEVEDON, BS21 5DF, as being the food business operator at YATTON TANDOORI, trading as S.M. YATTON LTD (Company No 6759195). There is no separate manager listed. I have provided PC KIRBY with copies of the above mentioned documents relating to YATTON TANDOORI. They have been exhibited as 1287JD/1.

Having accessed records relating to POSH SPICE, 86-88 HIGH STREET, NAILSEA, BS48 1AS, I can say that on 22nd May 2002 Mr Shaju MIAH was listed as the Food Business Operator. The record was raised following contact made with Shaju MIAH to arrange an appointment to visit before the premises opening. Golap MIAH was recorded as an alternative contact. I have provided records showing Shaju MIAH's involvement in this business in 2002 and 2003 as requested by PC KIRBY. The present Food Business Operator is Golap MIAH, trading as G.M. NAILSEA, and has been since 5th May 2005. The documents I have provided to PC KIRBY have been exhibited as 1287JD/2.

The Authority received a registration form for BRITANNIA SPICE, 2-4 DARK LANE, BACKWELL, BS48 3NP, signed by S.MIAH and dated 30th October 2009. The form indicated that the Food Business Operator was Iqbal MIAH, the manager was "Saju" MIAH and the intention was to open the business on 25th August 2009. A further application form dated 1st August 2011 detailed the Food Business Operator as Mr Shaju MIAH of 3 BANKS CLOSE, CLEVEDON, BS21 5DF. There is no separate manager listed. I have provided these documents to PC KIRBY as 1287JD/3.

I have completed numerous inspections over the years at all three of the above restaurants and have therefore met and spoken to Golap, Iqbal and Shaju MIAH in person. For some time these restaurants were performing poorly so visits by my team were fairly frequent. However, there was a sudden turnaround and the businesses now all have a Food Hygiene Rating of 5. Consequently our visits have become less frequent.

Anyone who handles food requires an appropriate certificate in food safety. Although I am a certified Level 2 trainer and assessor, as are my colleagues, workers from these restaurants speak very little English and tend to go to Bengali speaking courses in Easton, Bristol.

Therefore, I have not been directly involved in the training of any of the MIAH brothers or their employees. This language barrier also presents a problem when we conduct inspections as it is invariably one of the MIAH brothers that will act as an interpreter and they clearly know the answers to the questions we pose.

I can recall a time when, during two separate visits to POSH SPICE, two different individuals tried to present themselves as being the holder of the same certificate. Due to this we went through a phase of taking photos of each individual employee whilst they were holding their own food safety certificate. It appeared to me that the employees were trying to use one another's identities, possible in an attempt to avoid action being taking by my department. I have never encountered a female employee, whether a waitress, chef, or cleaning staff, at

any of the three businesses above. Our inspections can be carried at any time, although as we like to see the restaurants in operation with food preparation and service taking place, they tend to take place during opening hours.

There is a fourth restaurant linked to the MIAH brothers but I have had less personal involvement with inspections at this business. We became aware that PAPRIKA, 2 BROAD STREET, CONGRESBURY, BS49 5DG, was being operated by Mr Iqbal MIAH on 1 September 2012. Mr Iqbal MIAH informed my colleague Mr Peter HARDMAN of this when he conduted a routine unannounced inspection of the business. The most recent visit to this business was conducted by my colleague Peter HARDMAN at 1645 hours on 26th March 2013. The records he made as a result of this visit are accessible to me. From MR HARDMAN's records it appears the main food handler was Iqbal MIAH but it was not clear who was the Food Business Operator or manager. It appears that my colleague was informed that Mr Jan KOVAC was now the operator/proprietor of the business. Following this visit Mr

Golap and Iqbal MIAH appeared at Bristol Crown Court on Friday 21st February for sentencing. The fact that they are both personal licence holders was highlighted by the prosecution barrister but this wasn't mentioned further by the judge during sentencing.

Golap received an 18 month custodial sentence and Iqbal 16 months. The maximum sentence for this offence is 2 years and the judge took 25% off due to their guilty pleas, so overall it wasn't a bad result.

As I informed you previously, Shaju MIAH's case was discontinued and therefore it would appear that he will have to manage the businesses. He is not a personal licence holder to my current knowledge.

The Police has a Responsible Authority oppose the application for a Premise License for Posh Spice as they believe the applicant will not promote the Crime and Disorder Licensing Objective.

The premise itself was a Licensed Indian Restaurant for many years with a Mr Golap MIAH holding the license but following two enforcement visits to the premise on the 24th June 2022 and 18th February 2023 by the Immigration service when on both occasions illegal workers were discovered a Civil Penalty was served on the then Premise License Holder Mr Golap MIAH.

The Immigration Service then also called a review of the Premise License and following the hearing before this Licensing Committee on the 17th April 2023 the Premise License was Revoked.

A new application was received in June 2023 from a Ashequl Bari NUMAN for a Premise License at this premise. In the application it states that Mr Numan is the new owner of the business and shall have 100% control over the business and take all the decisions. Following receipt of this application Police Licensing Officer Andrew Manhire arranged a joint visit to the premise in company with Caz HORTON from North Somerset Council Licensing on Thursday 15th June to meet the applicant Mr Numan who police were aware had been working at Posh Spice at the time of the last Immigration Enforcement Visit.

On arrival they were not only met by Mr Numan but his proposed Designated Premise Supervisor Mohammed Iqbel MIAH who Mr Numan introduced as his uncle and business partner which clearly contradicts the statement on the application paperwork indicating that he was going to be the sole owner.

A discussion took place about Mr Numan's previous involvement at the premise and he indicated that he had worked there for about 12 months part time.

Mr Miah was asked if had any previous involvement with the business and whether he was related or had any previous connection with Mr Golap MIAH which he denied. It was then pointed out to him that it appeared he was connected with Golap MIAH from court records which he continued to deny. It was only after it was pointed out to him that both of them were convicted of Immigration Offences at Bristol Crown Court on the 21st February 2014 that he stated that there were so many defendants involved in that case and that was the reason he

gave the answer he did. (It was noted that despite both persons speaking good English when this was raised they started communicating in a foreign language). They have also both been resident at the same home address of 2 Banks Close, Clevedon.

Following this meeting it was confirmed by Peter HARDMAN and Jane DAY from North Somerset Council that far from not knowing each other Golap MIAH and Mohamed Iqbal MIAH were actually brothers (See attached statement from Peter HARDMAN and statement 1 and 2 from Jane DAY).

Mr Numan was asked when he took over the business and indicated it was roughly the end of May but when pushed was unable or unwilling to give an exact date. He was asked to provide any bank statements etc to show his purchase of the business but stated that no money was involved! He was then asked to provide a copy of the insurance certificate for the business, a copy of the lease and any other legal paperwork to evidence that he was the legal owner of the business as claimed but stated that he had this but it was not at the business premise at present but would forward these documents to me.

He later provided an insurance certificate for the business which was valid from the day after the meeting held with the Police and Council Licensing Officers and a Lease in his name.

This matter went before a Licensing Committee hearing on the 20th July 2023 but Mr Numan's solicitor withdraw the application at this hearing.

At the end of August 2023 a further Premise License application was received for the premise. This application was largely a copy of the withdrawn application with the exception that the nominated Designated Premise Supervisor had been changed from Mohammed Iqbal MIAH to Ashequl Bari NUMAN.

At just before 6pm on Wednesday 20th September 2023 a warrant was carried out on the premise under Immigration legislation by the Immigration service who were accompanied by staff from North Somerset Council Licensing and Food Teams along with Police Licensing Officer Andrew Manhir

Initially persons attempted to run from the premise via the rear doors but were detained. The premise was due to open at 6pm and there were no customers present, among the persons on the premise at the time were the Premise License applicant Ashequal Bari NUMAN and Mohammed Iqbal MIAH. Checks of the other persons present revealed two persons in breach of Immigration Law who were subsequently arrested. A closure order was therefore placed on the premises and the following morning the Immigration Service were successful in obtaining a Compliance Order at North Somerset Magistrates Court which allows them to make a visit every month for the next 6 months with a power of entry attached to the order.

Despite being told by Police and Council Licensing Officers at their meeting at the premise on the 15th June 2023 that with no license in place they needed to remove or at least cover all alcohol from view Andrew Manhire and Caz Horton saw there were many bottles of

white and rose wine including two part bottles clearly in view in a refrigerator next to the bar along with a bottle of champagne and bottles of Tiger beer. In addition on the lower shelf at the back of the bar there were many bottles of red wine clearly visible. Further checking of the premise revealed a bucket full with approx. 10 partially full bottles of various spirits still with the optic's attached located in the disabled toilet meaning that any customers including children would have unsupervised access. Mr NUMAN was again advised that all alcohol had to be removed or at least covered from sight.

The food team Inspectors wanted to check the flats above as it was indicated that it was used as a rest area by staff so they were asked for the keys to access the separate door to this area located at the front to the right of the premise and were informed that the keys were behind the bar. A bunch of keys were then located behind the bar which gave access to the flats which Mr Numan claims was being used as a rest area for staff. This bunch of keys also included a car key for a black Mercedes which belongs to Mohammed Iqbal MIAH, which clearly infers he still have considerable control over the business.

It is worthy of note that the company listed as the food operator at this premise is Maneera and Co Nailsea Ltd and company house records show two directors Ashequl Bari NUMAN and Mohammed Iqbal MIAH. (See statement of Jane DAY).

An appointment was made to see Mr NUMAN at the premise at 1pm on Wednesday 27th September 2023 to discuss this application and he was informed by Police Liquor Licensing Officer Andrew Manhire that at this meeting he would like to see all the documentary evidence he had to show that he owned the business.

Due to a family issue Mr NUMAN was unable to make the appointment so Andrew Manhire sent him and his agent a "e" male requesting various documents to assist in proving ownership of the business (See attached copy) and knowing that the Immigration Service were due to visit the premise later that day at just before 6pm he attended the Premise in company with Caz HORTON where they saw Mr NUMAN. Despite having a week's notice to gather documents together he was unable or unwilling to provide a single document requested.

When questioned about the lease he stated that he was sub-letting from Golap MIAH but paying the money for the lease direct to the premise owner. He was then asked to show his Bank account which the money came out of and initially got his mobile in order to do this but then stated he didn't have the card so could not access his account!

He was then asked about payment to Mr Golap MIAH for the fixture and fittings along with the goodwill built up by such an established business which is normal business practice but again claimed that no payment took place and that Mr Golap MIAH just wanted out and had gifted him the business as he was no longer in the Country. He accepted that the equipment in a professional kitchen, along with all the chairs, tables, individually Posh Spice crested tableware etc would cost 10,s of thousands of pounds!

In conclusion the Police strongly believes that the previous Premise License Holder Mr Golap MIAH still owns the business and that Mr Numan is merely a front man put forward purely for the purpose of obtaining a Premise Liquor License following this Licensing Committee decision to revoke the previous Premise License, in addition to which following the warrant carried out at the premise on the 20th September 2023 when yet again the premise were found to have persons working in breach of Immigration Law this being when Mr NUMAN is running the business and claiming to be the owner and therefore the Police feel that they have no option but to ask this Committee to reject this application.



I am Peter Terence Hardman. I am an Environmental Health Officer and Principal 1 Environmental Health Inspector in the Food, Health Commercial Safety Team, Public 2 Health & Regulatory Services, of North Somerset Council. I am duly authorised to 3 carry out food hyglene audits and enforcement in accordance with the Food Safety 4 Act and Retained Regulation EC No.852/2004. 5 On April 20th 2023 I took part in a multi-agency visit to Yatton Tandoori, 65 High 6 Street, Yatton BS49 4EQ with Immigration and Licencing Officers. The purpose of 7 the visit was for the immigration Officers to investigate intelligence received that 8 employees at the premises did not have the correct rights to work. 9 During the visit I undertook a full food hygiene inspection of the premises whilst 10 wearing body-worn camera. I concluded the visual inspection of the premises and 11 discussed my findings with Team Leader Jane Day. During the discussion I was 12 showing Mrs Day the Food Hygiene training certificates for Mr Shaju Miah when she 13 said "That's his brother. Golap's brother". 14 I stopped video recording at 20:20 and waited for the Immigration officers to 15 conclude their work. Whilst waiting, I spoke to a man who appeared to be in control 16 of the employees and asked his name and whether he was the manager. He 17

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18	responded to inform me that his name was Mohamed Miah but he was not the
19	manager and that he was only looking after the business that evening because he
20	usually worked at Posh Spice. I asked if he knew where Mr Shaju Miah was or who
21	he would return to the premises and was told that he did not know where Mr Miah
22	was or when he would return.
23	I noted the common surname of Miah and asked Mr Mohamed Miah if he was
24	related to Mr Shaju Miah. He confirmed that Mr Shaju Miah was his father but he
25	usually worked at Posh Spice with his uncle Mr Golap Miah.
26	I did not feel any need to challenge the information or request proof of identity

I, Jane Catherine Day, hold the post of Food and Commercial Safety Service Leader and am an authorised inspector of food safety and health and safety in the food and commercial safety team in the Regulatory Services division of the Public Health and Regulatory Services Directorate at North Somerset Council. I have held the post as a qualified food inspector and inspector of health and safety for over 30 years. I hold a NEBOSH qualification and am also registered with the Environmental Health Officers Registration Board and am a voting member of the Chartered Institute of Environmental Health. Prior to becoming the team manager I was a full time inspecting officer for over 26 years spending all of my career at North Somerset Council. I therefore have great knowledge of food businesses in North Somerset and of their ownership. Posh Spice in Nallsea is particularly rememberable to me as there is a long history of non-compliance, both in terms of food safety and in relation to immigration offences. Over the years I have dealt with Posh Spice, Nailsea,

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Yatton Tandoori, Yatton and Britannia Spice, Backwell. I am aware that the
businesses are owned by three brothers known to me as Golap Miah, Iqbal Miah and
Shaju Miah. Over the years the brothers have each made an appearance at each of
the restaurants, regardless of who its registered to, as they step in if their sibling is
not available. This has been common practice over the last 15 or so years. I have
met all three brothers on many occasions. In 2013 I was approached by PC Gemma
Kirby in relation to offences around 'arranged marriages' and I supplied a section 9
statement for the ensuing successful prosecution. In this statement I clearly state my
knowledge that the three gentlemen are brothers. I exhibit this statement at JCD1. I
also exhibit an email from PC Gemma Kirby following the prosecution hearing. The
email is entitled 'the Miah brothers' and gives a summary of the sentences they
received. This clearly infers that Golap Miah, Iqbal Miah and Shaju Miah are
brothers. I exhibit this email as JCD 2. On 31 October 2016 one of my colleagues
who has now left the authority conducted a food hygiene inspection at Posh Spice in
Nailsea. On his inspection notes he states that he interviewed Mr Iqbal Miah (despite
his brother, Golap Miah, being at that time the registered owner) and states that
Golap Miah was the chef along with the other brother Shaju Miah. This illustrates my
point above that the brothers often interchanged with each other and all oversaw the
running of the businesses collectively despite the registered ownership. I exhibit the
inspection report as JCD 3. On 7 March 2019 my colleague Ray Fox undertook
another food hygiene inspection at Posh Spice in Nailsea and despite Mr Golap Miah
being the registered owner he dealt with Mr Shaju Miah. This further illustrates my
point above. I exhibit this inspection report as JCD 4. I am aware that Mr Iqbal Miah

Regulation 14 of The Food Hygiene (England) Regulations 2006 provides a right of entry to premises in order to carry out compliance inspections. It is an offence to obstruct an officer working within this power. The frequency with which we make unannounced inspections of business premises is very much dependent on how they performed at the previous inspection and if any actions for improvement were set. We take a staged approach to enforcement, with the aim of assisting businesses to comply with the legislation by giving them a defined period of time to improve and meet the required legal standard. However, this depends on the issues encountered upon inspection; for example if I discovered a rodent infestation I would order the immediate closure of the premises, or if a hand wash basin was inaccessible or not fitted I would write a formal letter to the Food Business Operator and/or manager giving them a set time period to rectify this.

Following an inspection the business will be risk assessed to determine when the next inspection should occur. If a business is compliant and rated highly then it might be another 18-24 months before another inspection takes place. The Food Standards Agency has devised a Food Hygiene Rating scheme that gives a business a rating of 1 to 5, 5 being very good, depending on their performance in an inspection.

Records are compiled by officers who had personal knowledge of the matters dealt with in the course of their duties. The details included in this statement have been drawn from systems that I have access to and that hold these records. Some of the records will have been made by me, others by my team colleagues.

It is whilst carrying out my role as Principal Officer of Public Health that I have come to know Mr Golap MIAH, Mr Iqbal MIAH and Mr Shaju MIAH, three brothers of Asian decent who between them are, or have been, responsible for the following Indian restaurants/takeaways; YATTON TANDOORI, POSH SPICE, BRITANNIA SPICE and PAPRIKA.

I have completed a search of computer and paper based records for the above businesses and, as a result, have been able to provide the following to PC 1287 KIRBY as a result of her Data Protection Act request.

On 1st July 2002 Golap MIAH completed an application form to register a food business. He listed himself as the proprietor of YATTON TANDOORI, 65 HIGH STREET, YATTON, BA49 4EQ and the manager as Mizan ALI. On 5th April 2004 he submitted a further form to amend the manager to Golap MIAH. However, the form Golap MIAH had submitted didn't reflect the conversation he had had during an inspection on 2nd March 2004 where he Indicated to the attending officer that the business was owned by a limited company. As a result a letter dated 4th August 2004 was sent to Golap MIAH asking him to complete another registration form. On 8th August 2004 Golap MIAH completed this registration form but provided himself as the proprietor and Iqbal MIAH as the manager. On 17th November 2011 Shaju MIAH submitted an application form stating that he was now the manager and the proprietor of the business was "MR SHAHIDA NESSA GOLAP MIAH".

The most recent registration form, completed on 16th October 2012, lists Shaju MIAH of 20 BANKS CLOSE, CLEVEDON, BS21 5DF, as being the food business operator at YATTON TANDOORI, trading as S.M. YATTON LTD (Company No 6759195). There is no separate manager listed. I have provided PC KIRBY with copies of the above mentioned documents relating to YATTON TANDOORI. They have been exhibited as 1287JD/1.

Having accessed records relating to POSH SPICE, 86-88 HIGH STREET, NAILSEA, BS48 1AS, I can say that on 22nd May 2002 Mr Shaju MIAH was listed as the Food Business Operator. The record was raised following contact made with Shaju MIAH to arrange an appointment to visit before the premises opening. Golap MIAH was recorded as an alternative contact. I have provided records showing Shaju MIAH's involvement in this business in 2002 and 2003 as requested by PC KIRBY. The present Food Business Operator is Golap MIAH, trading as G.M. NAILSEA, and has been since 5th May 2005. The documents I have provided to PC KIRBY have been exhibited as 1287JD/2.

The Authority received a registration form for BRITANNIA SPICE, 2-4 DARK LANE, BACKWELL, BS48 3NP, signed by S.MIAH and dated 30th October 2009. The form indicated that the Food Business Operator was Iqbal MIAH, the manager was "Saju" MIAH and the intention was to open the business on 25th August 2009. A further application form dated 1st August 2011 detailed the Food Business Operator as Mr Shaju MIAH of 3 BANKS CLOSE, CLEVEDON, BS21 5DF. There is no separate manager listed. I have provided these documents to PC KIRBY as 1287JD/3.

I have completed numerous inspections over the years at all three of the above restaurants and have therefore met and spoken to Golap, Iqbal and Shaju MIAH in person. For some time these restaurants were performing poorly so visits by my team were fairly frequent. However, there was a sudden turnaround and the businesses now all have a Food Hygiene Rating of 5. Consequently our visits have become less frequent.

Anyone who handles food requires an appropriate certificate in food safety. Although I am a certified Level 2 trainer and assessor, as are my colleagues, workers from these restaurants speak very little English and tend to go to Bengali speaking courses in Easton, Bristol.

Therefore, I have not been directly involved in the training of any of the MIAH brothers or their employees. This language barrier also presents a problem when we conduct inspections as it is invariably one of the MIAH brothers that will act as an interpreter and they clearly know the answers to the questions we pose.

I can recall a time when, during two separate visits to POSH SPICE, two different individuals tried to present themselves as being the holder of the same certificate. Due to this we went through a phase of taking photos of each individual employee whilst they were holding their own food safety certificate. It appeared to me that the employees were trying to use one another's identities, possible in an attempt to avoid action being taking by my department.

I have never encountered a female employee, whether a waitress, chef, or cleaning staff, at any of the three businesses above. Our inspections can be carried at any time, although as we like to see the restaurants in operation with food preparation and service taking place, they tend to take place during opening hours.

There is a fourth restaurant linked to the MIAH brothers but I have had less personal involvement with inspections at this business. We became aware that PAPRIKA, 2 BROAD STREET, CONGRESBURY, BS49 5DG, was being operated by Mr (qbal MIAH on 1 September 2012. Mr Iqbal MIAH informed my colleague Mr Peter HARDMAN of this when he conduted a routine unannounced inspection of the business. The most recent visit to this business was conducted by my colleague Peter HARDMAN at 1645 hours on 26th March 2013. The records he made as a result of this visit are accessible to me. From MR HARDMAN's records it appears the main food handler was Iqbal MIAH but it was not clear who was the Food Business Operator or manager. It appears that my colleague was informed that Mr Jan KOVAC was now the operator/proprietor of the business. Following this visit Mr

This statement (consisting of 2 pages) is true to the best of my knowledge and belief and I make it knowing that, if it is tendered in evidence, I shall be liable to prosecution if I have wilfully stated in it anything which I know to be false or do not believe to be true.

I, Jane Catherine Day, hold the post of Food and Commercial Safety Service Leader and am an authorised inspector of food safety and health and safety in the food and commercial safety team in the Regulatory Services division of the Public Health and Regulatory Services Directorate at North Somerset Council. I have held the post as a qualified food inspector and inspector of health and safety for over 30 years. I hold a NEBOSH qualification and am also registered with the Environmental Health Officers Registration Board and am a voting member of the Chartered Institute of Environmental Health. Prior to becoming the team manager I was a full time inspecting officer for over 26 years spending all of my career at North Somerset Council. I therefore have great knowledge of food businesses in North Somerset and of their ownership. On Wednesday 20th September 2023 I visited Posh Spice, 86 High Street, Nailsea with immigration and licensing colleagues. The business is currently 'unrated' for food safety and awaiting inspection as a new food registration

P06 Signature

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was received on 16 June 2023. The food registration indicates that the business is operated by a company called Nameera and Co (Nailsea) Ltd. Companies house records show that this business was incorporated on 2 June 2023. Company house records also confirm two directors of the company, Mohammed Iqbal Miah and Ashequi Bari Numan. Both Mr Miah and Mr Numan were present when I visited Posh Spice and sat together at one of the restaurant tables. I have met both gentleman before on numerous ocassions. Mr Iqbal Miah is the brother of Golap and Shaju Miah. During the course of the visit it was indicated to me that the accommodation above the restaurant is used for staff resting. I asked to see this accommodation which is accessed via a separate door to the right of the restaurant main door. We were told that the keys were located behind the bar. The key to the flat accommodation was on the same set of keys belonning to a black Mercedes car. Mr Iqbal Miah confirmed that the car and the keys were his. This infers that Mr Iqbal Miah still has considerable control over the business. On viewing the accommodation I noted a set of stairs directly infront which led to 4 rooms. Access to 3 of these rooms was possible and in total 6 beds and paraphenlia akin to living accommodation was seen.
