That the sub committee determines the application for the grant of the Premises Licence.

1. Summary of report

1.1 An application has been received for the grant of a Premises Licence for Mendip Activity Centre, Lyncombe Drive, Sandford. Consultations have been carried out and a representation has been received from a local resident.

2. Policy

- 2.1 The Council's statement of Licensing Policy applies to this application.
- 2.2 The Licensing Act 2003 requires licensing authorities to carry out their functions with a view to promoting the following four licensing objectives:
 - a) The Prevention of Crime and Disorder.
 - b) Public Safety.
 - c) The Prevention of Public Nuisance, and
 - d) The Protection of Children from Harm.
- 2.3 The Licensing Authority should have regard to the Statutory Guidance issued under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003, and the provisions of the Licensing Act itself.

3. Details

3.1 An application was received on the 9 November 2023 from Mr Phillip Turner on behalf of Mendip Activity Leisure Centre for the Grant of a Premises Licence under the Licensing Act 2003, in respect of Mendip Activity Centre, Lyncombe Drive, Sandford

A copy of the application that has been made is shown at **Appendix A**.

3.2 The premises is an outdoor Education Centre providing activities and residential stays for schools, youth groups, corporate clients, special educational need groups and the public amongst others.

There are buildings at the main centre including a cafe-bar (Alpine Lounge) which would provide sales and alcohol consumption on the premises within the bar and on the floor above and surrounding balcony/terrace.

There is a bunkhouse lodge (Mendip Lodge) where alcohol would be on sale for consumption on and off the premises, in the bar, garden room and surrounding exterior garden areas.

There is also a campsite (Mendip Basecamp) where the provision of alcohol would be provided for consumption on and off the premises from a marquee/bottle bar and within the whole camping area.

- 3.3 Mendip Activity Centre has residential properties within 100 metres of the licensed premises.
- 3.4 A copy of a location plan and layout of the premises is shown at **Appendix B.**
- 3.5 The premises, currently holds a Premises Licence under the Licensing Act 2003, permitting Mendip Outdoor Pursuits, to carry on licensable activities. Mendip Activity Centre have previously applied for Temporary Event Notices for any licensable activities that fall outside the existing Premises Licence. A copy of the current Premises Licence is shown at **Appendix C**.

 - (a) While live or recorded music is being played outside, including events at the campsite), external patrols will be carried out by staff to monitor noise levels at the boundary of neighbouring residential dwellings and take appropriate action to lower the volume of the music, as necessary.

A copy of the agreed additional condition was sent to all Responsible Authorities on 6 December 2023 A copy of the correspondence can be found at **Appendix D**





- (g) the sale or supply of Alcohol to any canteen or mess, being a canteen in which the sale or supply of Alcohol is carried out under the authority of the Secretary of State or an authorised mess of members of Her Majesty's naval, military or air forces;
- (h) the taking of Alcohol from the premises by a person residing there; or
- the supply of Alcohol for consumption on the premises to any private friends of a person residing there who are bona fide entertained by him at his own expense, or the consumption of Intoxicating Liquor by persons so supplied; or
- (j) the supply of Alcohol for consumption on the premises to persons employed there for the purposes of the business carried on by the holder of the licence, or the consumption of Alcohol so supplied, if the liquor is supplied at the expenses of their employer or the person carrying on or in charge of the business on the premises.

OFF LICENCES AND OFF SALES DEPARTMENTS OF ON-LICENSED PREMISES

Permitted Hours

(S. 60, 63, 86 LA 1964)

Open containers and no consumption

(S. 164 LA 1964)

Alcohol shall not be sold in an open container or be consumed in the licensed premises.

Mandatory Conditions

- 1. (1). No supply of alcohol may be made under this premises licence:-
 - (i) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
 - (ii) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
 - (2) Every supply of alcohol under this premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- **2.** (1) The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.

 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to-
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;

- (d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on-
 - (i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or
 - (ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;
- (e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
- **3.** The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- **4.** The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.
- 6. The responsible person shall ensure that-
 - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures-
 - (i) beer or cider: ¹/₂ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and
 - (b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.

Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the operating Schedule

GENERAL:

1. After 23:00, Monday to Sunday (22:30 Sunday), sale of alcohol will only be to residents and their bona fide guests, customers attending a prearranged function and people eating or who have eaten a meal on the premises.

PREVENTION OF CRIME & DISORDER:

2. Staff monitor customer behaviour.

PUBLIC SAFETY:

3. Staff are trained in first aid and qualified first aiders are on site.

PREVENTION OF PUBLIC NUISANCE:

4. Live music takes place in part of the premises where noise outbreak can be contained and minimised.

PROTECTION OF CHILDREN FROM HARM:

- 5. Staff are vetted/CRB checked.
- 6. No AWP machines on premises.
- 7. Cigarette machine is located so it is visible from the bar.

Annex 3 – Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority

- 1. Noise from regulated entertainment at the premises shall be maintained at a level that will not be audible at the façade of neighbouring noise sensitive premises.
- 2. During regulated entertainment, all doors and windows at the premises shall remain closed, except for access and egress to the premises.
- 3. Regulated entertainment shall be limited to Fridays and Saturdays, except for twelve additional events in any calendar months, and those events shall be notified to residents of neighbouring properties.



We believe, at the minimum, that the Live Music and Outdoor Entertainment should be removed from this licence to avoid a festival atmosphere and reduce noise to the local neighbourhood.

Throughout the summer months last year the activity centre turned into a large camp site called Base Camp, for which I don't believe they have formal planning permission. They operate through a Schools and Groups exception certificate, I presume from Natural England.

They use the former hotel 'Lyncombe Lodge' as a kind of Club House for the Campsite, where they are promoting and hosting live outdoor music performances through the whole of the summer. This is from approx. 6pm -10pm throughout parts of July and then the whole of August.

With the large number of campers on site this creates a festival type environment directly next to our home. The noise is excessive. I a

We live directly next to the Activity Centre and Lyncombe lodge and the sound just travels down through the valley. We hear all of the music, singing, bottles being emptied into bins, etc. The site is just very noisy generally and with the live music throughout the summer we cannot sit outside with any peace or have any quiet enjoyment of our home.

Added to the excessive noise from this site throughout the summer, We also have to accept excessive lights, noise, and music from the toboggan slope throughout the winter, we just do not get any piece whatsoever.

If we could move home we would. They have made our home life very unpleasant.

We have raised multiple complaints to N-somerset council through their breach in planning portal, Our local Councillor and the noise team. But nothing seems to get done or changed.

If this application is successful, it would just allow them to do more and more in a AONB which is supposed to be a peaceful area.

Hi Phil,

I've had a discussion with the planning and enforcement teams.

The Activity Centre have a "certificate of lawfulness" for the activities that they are carrying on at the main centre.

There is an issue with planning permission for the "Base Camp." While permission is not required for temporary campsites, Base Camp exceeds the 28 day limit for this. The planning team are in discussions with the Activity Centre to work this through, as there are some complexities to the situation that need to be sorted out.

I plan on popping across to the Activity centre (together with the new Councillor for Sandford) to understand their plans better and to make sure they are aware of local concerns.
