



Progress

NSC's second Rights of Way Improvement Plan was approved in December 2022.

The focus for 2023/24 so far has been:

- ongoing maintenance
- responding to public concerns
- planning the capital-funded improvement works for this financial year
- planning/preparing for a UKSPF-funded project to deliver accessibility improvements across 15 RoW
- recruitment



UK Shared Prosperity Fund

- £36K to improve routes & communicate the improvements
- 15 public rights of ways across North Somerset (including in: Backwell, Bleadon, Churchill, Clevedon, Hutton, Kewstoke, Long Ashton, Nailsea, Weston in Gordano, Winscombe)
- Wide range of improvement measures including: vegetation removal/overhanging branch reduction, tarmacking of paths, re-stoning of paths, improving sight lines, bridge refurbishment/replacement, gate removal, pothole repair and creation of ramped access
- Approximately half the routes will be addressed this financial year, with the remainder in the 2024-25 period.
- Installation of 15 footfall counters

2023-24 Capital Allocation

- £100k allocation each year for 2023-24 and 2024-25 to deliver the improvements highlighted in the RoWIP
- 292 route improvements nominated by Town and Parish Councils:
 - \circ 173 of these have been completed,
 - 12 are under investigation or in progress
 - 107 are not currently possible to achieve or have been investigated and no work is required at this time.
- 2023-24 allocation will be used to fund the route improvements and pedestrian counters to monitor footfall
- UKSPF Comms role will promote these improvements
